



Directions to the workshop:

Get a Maui road map and use it. The workshop will be held in a house on the other side of Hana located at the 48 mile marker.

While there are 2 small food stores in Hana, they don't have very big selections. I suggest you buy supplies in Paia. Mana Foods on Baldwin is a good place to shop. I also recommend the Fish Market for lunch which is on the corner of Baldwin and Hana Hwy.

Driving from Paia toward Hana, the road quickly changes into a very slow, twisty road with multiple switchbacks and speeds between 10 - 30 MPH. This is a very slow, but very scenic road and best driven for the first time in daylight. It gets dark about 7pm and the drive takes about 2 hours, so it's best to leave by 5pm.

As you enter the Hana area, you will approach a fork in the road - but actually it is more of a right turn. The Hana Police station is on the corner and turn right. Enjoy the short ride through Hana town. The old Hasegawa store on your left and then the gas station on the right mark the end of Hana town. After Hana town the mile markers change and begin at 51 and go down. Drive about 3 miles and watch for mile marker 48 on the left. A white bridge is just after the 49 mile marker. The house opposite mile marker 48 with the driveway just before mile marker is where the workshop will be held. Park on the grass in front or on the right side of the house.

The phone for the house is 808-248-7486 - do not call this number before the class dates and then only if an emergency or something important comes up.

Some of the class may be held outside in the carport or in the yard, so being bug repellant. There are not a lot of bugs, but some people are more sensitive than others. Also, consider bringing sunscreen.

Also, during lunch some of the students may go to Hamoa beach or Venus pool or Red beach - so bring your bathing suit and towel. We may also hike to a waterfall on Sunday, so bring your hiking shoes.

Note: Activities outside the class room location such as swimming, hiking etc. are done at the discretion of the student and at the students own risk.
